## Pre-Nursing UNMC Requirements

Pre-nursing students have many options within Omaha. Students need to complete approximately 2 years of pre-requisites to be eligible to apply to UNMC's College of Nursing, where they take another 2 years of classes to earn a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) from UNMC. The courses listed below are the pre-requisites needed to be able to apply to this BSN program at UNMC. Students must complete a minimum of 12 out of the 17 requirements before applying, and have an active CNA license.

No grade below "C+" will be accepted for UNMC's prerequisites.

The minimum GPA for all prerequisites courses must be 3.0 or higher.

Any repeated coursework will be averaged.

Students are also able to transfer to other nursing schools to receive a BSN. Admissions requirements vary by program. Students with a bachelor's degree may consider an accelerated BSN program offered by Creighton University, Nebraska Methodist College and University of Nebraska Medical Center. Admissions requirements vary by program.
