



# LANGUAGE CELEBRATION FAQ

## How large can groups be for each event?

We recommend keeping groups to 5 or 6 students.

## Are students able to create group submissions for the different activities? If so, how many students are allowed in a group?

It is a great idea for students to work collaboratively on their submissions! We trust teachers to determine how many participants are reasonable per event – though we would not recommend a group larger than 5 or 6 students.

## Do students send their presentations ahead of time, or just bring them the day of the event?

Students can bring their presentations the day of the event. Depending on the number of students attending the event, this may change. Our team will be in contact with new instructions if this happens.

## How do we sign up students for events?

Event selection is a part of the registration process. As part of the registration process, there are two forms that you will complete: a) payment for students attending, and b) a form that will prompt you to enter additional information on events and meals. Registration is due **February 1, 2025**.

## Is the poster project an individual event, or can it be done with a partner?
