Participants will explore key risk factors for fraud, waste, and abuse, review Nebraska-specific Medicaid policies and compliance procedures, and learn how to address audit findings effectively. The session emphasizes actionable strategies for documentation, corrective action planning, and maintaining program integrity.

Learning Objectives

- Identify common risk factors and red flags associated with fraud, waste, and abuse in Medicaid programs
- Become familiar with Nebraska-specific Medicaid policies and procedures for compliance and documentation
- Develop skills to appropriately address audit findings and implement corrective action plans.
