Mr. Alemán's local and national work is based in dismantling systems of oppression and shifting power to those who are targets of these oppressive systems. His vast expertise includes the following areas: LGBTQ+ communities, mental health, case management, community engagement, advocacy, supervision, reproductive justice, and more. In response to his community-based work, Mr. Alemán has been recognized by his community with the 2018 Heartland Pride Brad Fuglei Impact Award, 2019 Young, Black, and Influential Award for Advocacy, 2019 Ten Outstanding Young Omahans Award, 2021 Omaha Entertainment and Arts Award, NASW-NE 2022 Social Worker of the Year Award, 2023 Notable Nebraskan, and 2024 Nebraska Mentoring Practitioner of the year.
