In the fall 2023 semester, the Division of Student Life and Wellbeing conducted a Student Needs Survey from the Hope Center for College, Community, and Justice to assess UNO students' basic needs. The overall findings are below.

Demographic Disparity

Students of color, female students, LGBTQIA+ students, Pell-grant eligible students, full-time students, and parenting students consistently face significantly higher rates of basic needs insecurities than their counterparts.

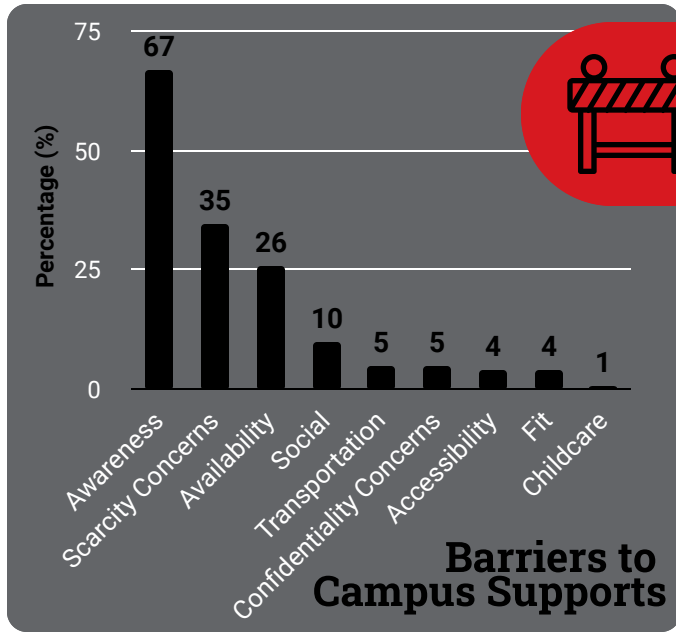
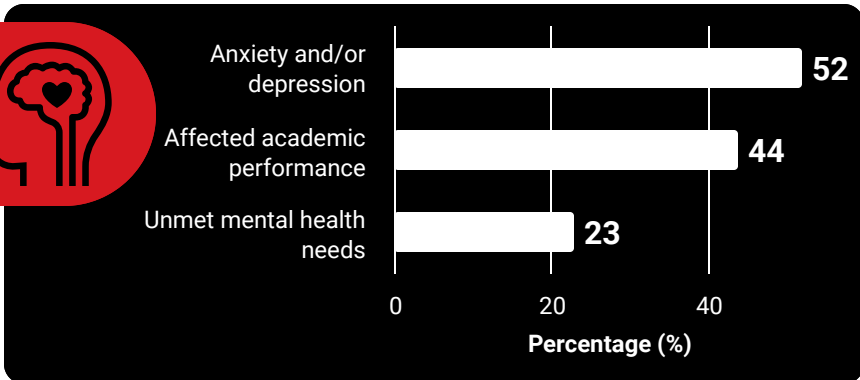

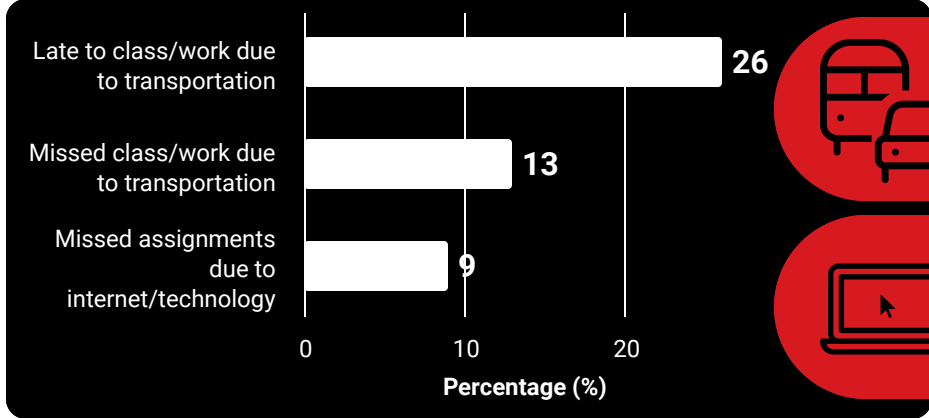
