- **Formal Admission Process to Teacher Preparation Programs**  
 All Pre-Education students interested in becoming teachers must formally apply for admission to the University of Nebraska at Omaha Teacher Preparation Programs. Admission is selective. Applications are reviewed by the College of Education's Admission Review Committee. The deadlines for admission to the C.O.E. are:

March 1	June 1	October 1
