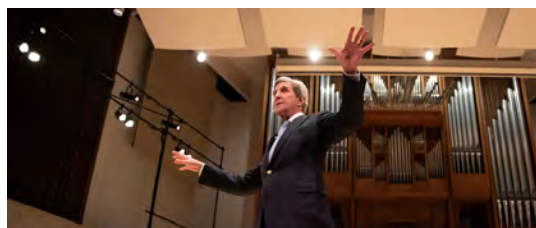

CHUCK HAGEL SYMPOSIUM IN PUBLIC SERVICE

First hosted in 2018, the Chuck Hagel Symposium in Public Service connects hundreds of high school students from the greater Omaha metropolitan area with university and community experts in a variety of fields, all sharing their perspectives on public service.

The goal of the Symposium is to introduce Omaha's best and brightest young people to the value and impact of civic engagement, leadership, and service.



CHUCK HAGEL ARCHIVES

Hagel has a long-established relationship with UNO's Criss Library, which hosts the U.S. Senator Chuck Hagel Archives.

The Hagel Archives contains records from his career as U.S. Senator, 1997 to 2009, and U.S. Secretary of Defense, 2013 to 2015, and includes his legislative papers, artifacts, photographs, campaign records, and other materials.

LESSONS & LEGACIES

In 2016, Hagel partnered with UNO to host a two-day symposium exploring the lessons and legacies of the Vietnam War with national Vietnam veteran leaders, public officials, and journalists.

More than 50 years after America's official involvement in Vietnam, questions remain about how that war shaped us politically, culturally, and socially, at the national, state, and local levels.

The symposium featured experts discussing the lessons and legacies of the war from a variety of perspectives.
